Hello from the chaplaincy team!

You have probably seen us leading liturgical prayer and other events this year. We wear a small gold cross as a sign that we are part of the chaplaincy team. This year, we have been a huge team of 25 members!

We have really enjoyed leading the school in prayer, Mass and special occasions. One of our Year 6 lay chaplains Alfie, was inspired to help others and said 'my favourite activity was when we went to a younger year group and helped them to use the Let Us Pray 2gether resource box. It is great to see younger children joining in with our mission statement and school prayer in our liturgical prayer.' Thomas is one of our Year 5 lay chaplains who also commented, 'I was inspired by my brother being in the chaplaincy team so I applied in year 4 and now we can inspire new members like Jesus inspires us'.



The chaplaincy team are responsible for leading the school to develop their spiritual journey. Miranda in Year 5 explained, 'as a team, we decided that we would like the children at St Teresa's to have more opportunity for innovative prayer so we set up two lunch time groups to provide extra time for personal prayer in our prayer area. Our Key Stage One Prayer Group joins together once a week to write their own prayer intentions led by some of our Year 5 lay chaplains. The Year 6 chaplaincy team lead the lunch time Lectio Divina group for Key Stage Two, which gives children the chance to read from scripture and think about the message to be lived out in our lives.'
