Welcome back

We hope you had an enjoyable summer break with your families and are looking forward to a very busy term.


The RE topics of this term are Families, Belonging and Waiting. We will be thinking about our families, what communities we belong to and coming up to Christmas we will be thinking about waiting during Advent.

RSHE

The children will be thinking about how God made all of his children out of love and for love. We will also be encouraging children to celebrate similarities and differences between people.

Literacy

Our topics this term are 'What makes a good place to live?' looking at The Bog Baby. After half term we will be considering 'What does it feel like to be lost?' using the book Lost and Found. We will be focusing on using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops when writing a sentence.



Maths

We will be focusing on basic counting skills and place value within 20. We will also be looking at addition and subtraction within 10.

Science

We are learning about animals. We will be describing animal features and sorting them into groups—living and non-living things, omnivores, herbivores and carnivores. After half term we will be looking at different Seasons.

Geography/History

In Geography we are learning about our local area. We will be looking at towns and cities, and different characteristics that they have.

We would really appreciate if you could talk to your child about these topics. Maybe go to the library and borrow some books about them.


Uniform
