Welcome back! We hope that you have had a peaceful, safe and enjoyable summer and are rested ahead of a new school year.


RE

This term we will be learning about: People, Called and Gift.

People: In this topic, Children will learn that the Church names the family 'The Domestic Church' where children may begin to understand the church which is 'Nothing other than the family of God'. This topic explores the truth that Jesus had a natural family with real people with names and a history. The children will have the opportunity to create their own family tree and compare this with Jesus' family tree.

RSHE: This term in RSHE, we will be following the Life to the Full scheme, module one: Created and Loved by God. We will be learning about the Sacraments and how to respect our bodies.

Called: Throughout this topic, we will learn about how our lives are marked by many different experiences of being welcomed into new situations and groups. Children will explore how through Baptism and Confirmation, people are given the gift of the Holy Spirit and are called to respond in their lives.



We have sent home the first topic's knowledge organizer for you to follow our learning.

WHAT IS MY MISSION?

MATHS

At the start of this term, we will be covering place value followed by adding and subtracting up to four digit numbers. In the latter weeks, we will look at multiplication and division. The children will continue to be set weekly Mathletics challenges as part of their homework, as well as the Maths questions on the weekly homework sheet. These activities help support the learning taking place in class. Also, children will begin to practice and prepare for their Times Table Assessment by using the Rockstar Online Application.

<u>Homework</u>

Homework will go home on Friday every week ranging from practice maths questions, mental maths, reading, punctuation, spelling and research tasks for our learning the following week. Please ensure homework is handed in by the following Wednesday.

We ask that you check your child's work and initial it before it comes back to school.

It is also expected that children in Year 4 should read aloud every night for 15-20 minutes covering at least 15 pages of their book. Please could we ask you to record their reading in the diaries on a daily basis and sign this. This will allow the children to earn their stickers which contribute towards earning their Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards. Daily reading is proven to have a huge impact on a child's academic progress so we do hope you support us in fostering a love of books for your child.

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Topic: Our question for our first half-term is, 'Where do rivers flow to?'. We will be exploring the journey of different rivers and the water cycle through geography. Our Geography next half term will explore the Wonders of the World and knowledge of key geographic features around the world.



Science: This term in science we will be learning about changes of state, and how we can identify the differences between solids, liquids and gases. After half term, our question is, "What's all that racket?", learning about how sound is made. We will be finding out all about how we hear.

You will find the knowledge organisers for this half term's Geography and Science included, for you to follow our learning and share some of the key facts that have been taught at school.

Literacy: The exciting book that we will be studying in Literacy this term is "The Land of Roar' by Jenny McLachlan. We will be learning how to use fronted adverbials and how to make effective language choices, including expanded noun phrases.
