


Did you know that 52% of 3-4 year olds go online for an average of 9 hours a week? Create online safety discussions!

Although parental controls and filters are helpful, developing our own critical thinking towards online safety can have a much bigger impact and give young people more confidence when navigating the online world. Create discussion in the household about safer internet use while talking about certain scenarios that they may encounter online so they feel prepared around how to appropriately respond. Build their confidence in knowing how to ignore unwanted friend requests, leaving harmful online chats, reporting individuals or refraining from over-sharing personal information.
