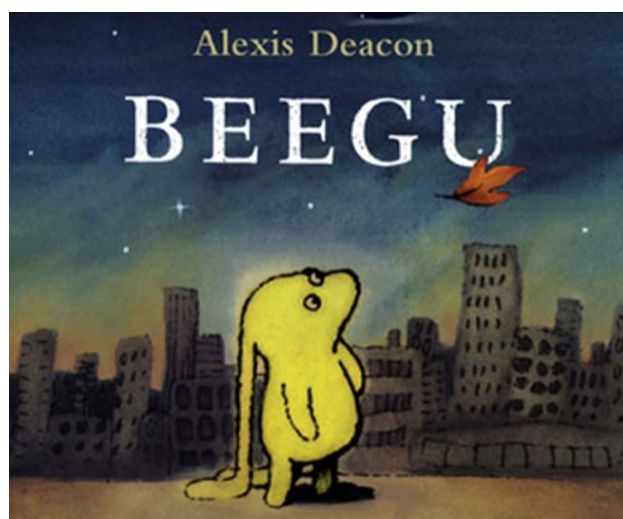
The RE topics this term are Special People, Meals and Change. We will focus on special people within the parish and what we do during mass.

Literacy

Our topics this term are 'What would an alien think of Planet Earth?' looking at the story of Beegu. After half term we will be reading the story of Dogger. In our writing we will be focusing on using full stops, capital letters and joining our sentences together with 'and'.

Maths

We will be focusing on basic counting skills. We will be practising strategies for addition and subtraction up to 20. We will be thinking about place value and using our knowledge of number bonds to solve sums.



Science

We are learning about materials. We will be describing and sorting materials into groups. After half term we will be looking at comparing different materials. Please see the knowledge organiser for more detail.

Geography/History

In History we are learning about changes in living memory. We will think about how our lives differ to our grandparents childhood. After half term we will be answering the question 'What is it like to live in the UK?' in our Geography topic. Please see the knowledge organiser for more detail.

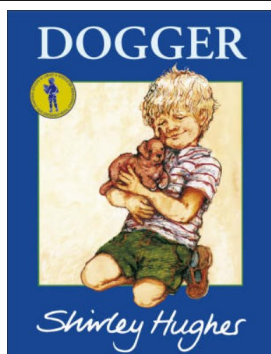
PE on Tuesdays

Reading at home

We hope you have enjoyed sharing the special books with your child. **Please continue to read with your child every night and ensure that you write in their organiser so that we know that they have read at home and we can reward them with a sticker each week.**



Make sure your child practices their spellings too, these can be found inside their reading organisers each week. Spellings will be given out on Fridays and tested in school on the following Friday. Your child needs to bring their reading books to school every day so that can read at school.
