Welcome to our March Newsletter. As Easter approaches I would like to thank the children, parents, staff and governors for your continued support in ensuring St Teresa's School continues to be a vibrant learning community that bears witness to our Gospel values.

We have lots to celebrate.

Please see the report from the Nottingham post celebrating our recent achievements. (March 2024). Congratulations to everyone.

A Nottingham school has been placed in the top one per cent of primaries in England, making it one of the 50 best in the country. St. Teresa's Catholic Primary School in Aspley has been given the recognition following its Key Stage 2 results.

The school is in the top one per cent for reading, writing and maths Key Stage 2 tests, as well as the phonics screening check, 'highlighting the school's commitment in providing quality education'. It is also ranked within the top 200 performing schools in the multiplication tables test.

Ann Glynne-Jones, Headteacher of St. Teresa's Catholic Primary School, shared her gratitude to the school community for their hard work and dedication. She said: "Our inclusion among the top 50 primary schools in England is a testament to the dedication, commitment and hard work of our pupils, staff and the wider school community.

At St. Teresa's, we believe in instilling a sense of aspiration and high ambition that empowers every child to reach their full potential academically, whilst also nurturing their moral, spiritual and social development." Ms Glynne-Jones added that the achievement marks a 'significant achievement in educational excellence and pupil success'.

The school proudly holds two Outstanding Ofsted ratings, which recognises 'the high-quality teaching, leadership and educational opportunities' for their pupils. In November 2023, the school also received a second Outstanding rating following its Catholic School Inspection, 'further highlighting its commitment to excellence in all aspects of Catholic life'.

### **School Photographer**

The School Photographer will be in school on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> May for class photographs.

#### Uniform Reminder

The school PE kit is a plain white t-shirt and plain black shorts/leggings/jogging bottoms (no logos or brands). Children will need to wear their school jumper or cardigan and plimsoles or sensible sport trainers. Children in Year 6 can wear their St Teresa's hoodie. No other items of sportswear are permitted.

As the weather is getting warmer children may now wear their summer uniform. This consists of brown check dress for girls (we would consider yellow check if brown is unavailable) with a brown cardigan and boys may wear short trousers and a short-sleeved shirt, however a school jumper and school tie is still required at all times. If the weather becomes particularly warm, the teacher will allow the children to remove their jumpers/cardigans during the school day.

Shoes need to be black school shoes with laces or straps – no branding visible. Black Trainers <u>are not acceptable</u> for school.

Jewellery, particularly earrings are **not allowed**. Watches are allowed (but only simple analogue).

### Hairstyles


We ask that parents be reminded of the school's expectations regarding hairstyles in line with our Uniform Policy:

- Hair should be one natural colour, no hair dye.
- The style should be appropriate for school; hair should not obstruct pupils' vision.
- Long hair must be tied back.
- Boys' hair should be no shorter than **Grade 2.**
- Tramlines, patterns and sculpting are not allowed
- Coloured extensions and beads are not allowed
- Natural hair coloured extensions of a reasonable length need to be tied back.

If policy is not followed, parents will be contacted and arrangements made for school child to stay in at play/lunchtime/ not represent the school at any events or attend after school activities.

## **Reading Reminder**

It is well proven that children who read regularly, read well, and we know that reading is vital to learning. We have a policy that your child should be reading 5 times a week at home, and that a parent must sign the reading log to say that they have read. This reading log comes to school each day, and is checked for a signature. If a child has not read 5 times in that week, then they will have to stay in at break time on a Monday to read for 10 minutes (and then go outside for 5 minutes play). Surprisingly, this rule tends to stop arguments in the evening about reading, as the children know they will be checked up on in school! A week runs from Monday to Sunday, and all organisers will be checked on a Monday — it is important a child reads at least once over the weekend.



### **Staffing Update**

Mrs Hewlett will be leaving her two-day post at St Teresa's School after Easter. She is a valued member of staff and she will be missed. As well as teaching she has been the leader of special educational needs. We wish her all the best in her new post. We are currently advertising for a new leader of SEND.

We also welcome our new Attendance Officer, Miss White who has recently joined St Teresa's. Miss White is also the Attendance Officer at Trinity and is looking forward to working across both schools. She'll be in school on Mondays to Thursdays during the morning but will available at other times, if required, upon request.

# **PTA Update**
