Library Books

We are starting our Handwriting
homework to support your child's
letter formation. Homework will be

Reading

It is essential to read 5 times a
week at home to support your
child's progress in reading. Please
sign your child's diaries. There is
lots of helpful information about
the questions to ask whilst reading
with at home in each reading book.

RE

The RE topics for this term are
Good News, Friends and Our
World. We will be learning about
the feast of Pentecost and think-
ing about how we can be a good
friend to everyone.



RSHE

The third topic explores that we are created
to live in community. It helps children to
understand the wider world and the im-
portance of working for the common good.

Maths

We will be focusing on adding and take away
and then doubling and halving.

We have a weekly 'Learn it' each week. This
is a simple sum that we need to know. We
show the children it in both ways.

Our 'Learn its' for this term are:

$$10 + 0 = 10 \text{ and } 0 + 10 = 10$$

$$9 + 1 = 10 \text{ and } 1 + 9 = 10$$

$$8 + 2 = 10 \text{ and } 2 + 8 = 10$$

$$7 + 3 = 10 \text{ and } 3 + 7 = 10$$

$$6 + 4 = 10 \text{ and } 4 + 6 = 10$$

$$5 + 5 = 10$$

Ask your children to tell you what the learn
it is for this week!
