#### Lateness



As we look forward to Advent, we are reminded to wait patiently for things in our lives. We will share our Advent Retreat Day on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> December, with a focus on the Bishop's theme of 'Encounter'. We will start this day with our Advent Mass in school at 9.30am. All welcome.

### **Other Faiths Week**

This will start on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> November, we will be exploring and sharing Other Faiths in school. All classes will be learning about Judaism and have the opportunity to explore traditions and celebrations within this religion. On Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> November, Year 4, 5 and 6 will participate in the workshop, 'Sacred Spaces', led by the Jewish Museum, London. This will explore the importance and significance of the Synagogue, and routines and traditions of prayer in Judaism.

### Class liturgical prayer workshop

As part of our Collective Worship provision at St Teresa's, pupil leadership of liturgical prayer is of high importance. We come together as a whole school, key stages and year groups throughout each week. All classes have the opportunity to plan and lead their class liturgical prayer to provide some reflective time during the busy school week to gather together and bring the message of scripture into focus.

Children can play in any game mode with every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, earning themselves, their class and the school a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average - the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours, subject to a daily 60-minute limit. Winning classes in the school and in the competition as a whole will be the ones with the highest average.

## **Admission to Infant/Primary Education**

The admissions process for entry into Foundation Year September 2025 has begun. If your child will be 5 during the academic year September 2025 to August 2026 you will need to be making an application at this time. Please ensure you also complete a Supplementary Form with details of your faith and provide a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate. The closing date for all applications is **15<sup>th</sup> January 2025**. Any applications submitted after this date will be classed as late. This could mean your child may not get a place.

St Teresa's will be open for prospective families to visit and have a look around the school before they submit their application. This will be on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> November between 9.30am until 11.00am by appointment only. Please call the school office on 0115 9155762 to book your place.

### Winter Weather

As the weather gets colder please ensure your child has a suitable winter coat, scarf, gloves, etc as learning takes place inside and outside. All children should now be wearing their winter uniforms. May I remind you that all uniform should be clearly marked with your child's name. If your child wears boots to walk to school they must bring school shoes to change into.
