Maths

At the start of this term we will be covering; angles, problem solving and statistics. The children will continue to be set weekly Spag.co.uk challenges as part of their homework, as

well as the Times Tables questions in the revision books. These activities help support the learning taking place in class. The children also have access to Times Tables Rock Stars, this is to help with the fluency and speed of their times tables.

Homework

We ask that you check your child's work and initial it before it comes back to school. It is expected that children in Year Six should read every night for approximately 20 minutes (including reading aloud), and will be asking you to record their reading in the school organiser on a daily basis (including independent reading).

The homework set is directly linked to our work in class and it is very important that your child completes their homework on time.

Spellings and times tables will be tested on a Friday.

Topic & Science

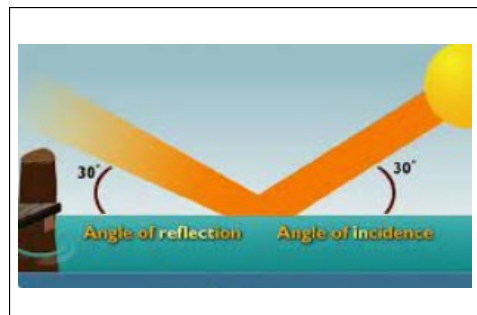
PE
